

SMALL MUSEUM, TUNNEL BOAT TRIP & SHORT ORIENTATION TALK



Small informative museum - charts the history of Regents Canal and the ice trade which shaped the canals.

i) There are a number of exhibitions to explore over two floors:-

Lifting and handling
Tractor & Horse Power
Water and Locks
London's Living Waterways (including archive film)
Boats and Cargoes
London Waterways Map

ii) There is a 10 minute orientation talk on arrival (welcome to the Museum).

iii) Tunnel Narrow Boat Trip (Regents Canal)

A ride on the Tunnel Boat (878 meters Tunnel length)) which will last fifty minutes (the boat hold twelve), fitted out for passengers with windows and seats and tables for complimentary teas and coffees. Includes commentary.
